



Benefits of eDA begin to flow

Councils have already started to reap benefits from the HAF-eDA project. Recent data shows that the development industry and broader community are already taking advantage of these new eDA tools.

The introductory eDA tools in Fraser Coast Regional Council alone show a staggering 10,000 hits and 40,000 page views since August 2009. While most users of the tools are within Australia, a number are from overseas locations such as the Philippines, New Zealand, USA, UK, Singapore, Canada, Ireland, France and Germany.

The introductory eDA tools, currently being rolled out in regional high growth Queensland councils, assist with online access to property information and planning schemes.

These tools are a convenient way for users to easily check how a planning scheme may apply to a proposed development, and to monitor the progress of a development application.

The number of development applications lodged online also continues to increase with almost 1000 applications lodged via 18 councils through Smart eDA.

With an additional 13 councils to 'go live' with eDA tools over the coming months, the uptake of eDA will continue to increase, as will the benefits.
