Six-Point Plan:

2. support THE BIG Facilities

we Need

Big reductions in waste require a big investment in infrastructure. Councils are calling for an audit of gaps, and a clear investment plan from the State – that matches recycling targets.

3. invest in education

Behaviour change takes time and money. Think how the 'slip, slop, slap' campaign protected our skin over decades – we need a behaviour change campaign for waste.



4. SUPPORT TO BUILD Markets

Incentives to support and increase markets like **organics** and **recyclables**. This includes logistics, like funding for transport to take rubbish to end markets – especially in such a decentralised state as Queensland.

5. HOLD Producers to account

Stop waste at the start.
Councils want standards for producers to help manage problem waste streams, like tyres that clog up our landfill and continue to harm our environment.

Get on 6. With the Job

Less red tape means quicker information for councils and faster action.
