## We are pleased to see ...



\$200m for Works for Queensland over 4 years for councils to boost local jobs and community infrastructure.

\$280m over 4 years for the **Transport Infrastructure Development Scheme (TIDS)** to continue to provide safer roads.





\$3m over 2 years to expand QCoast<sub>2100</sub> program to help councils prepare communities for climate risk.

\$50m in economic stimulus for SEQ councils over 4 years.





Council access to an additional \$20m through the Queensland Tourism Activation Fund.

An additional \$6m over 4 years for the prevention of domestic and family violence in vulnerable populations.



## **We will continue** to work towards ...



Long term commitment to Works for Qld with \$100m pa to continue to create local jobs where they are most needed.

Extra \$500m to ensure safe and reliable water supply and wastewater management for rural and remote communities.



**Increased TIDS funding** to keep up with demand for safe and reliable roads and support hundreds of local jobs.

\$50m pa for SEQ Community Stimulus package to support hundreds more local jobs.





A \$200m Sustainability **Fund** to support council resource recovery and waste management initiatives.

10 per cent increase to State **Government Financial** Aid (SGFA) to First Nations councils to boost local Indigenous employment.
