Welcome to LGAQ's Coastal Leaders Forum 2022



The 2022 LGAQ Coastal Leaders Forum is the first of its kind, bringing together leaders from Queensland's 41 coastal councils with other tiers of government and industry stakeholders to advance the liveability and resilience of our coastal cities and regions.

With more than half of Queensland's local governments situated along the coastline, this forum presents a timely opportunity for councils to discuss particular and shared challenges which impact their communities.

The theme for the inaugural event is Our Coast, Our Future and the two-day forum will focus on the changing risk profiles of our coastal communities and the economic transition many of these councils are pursuing. Councils will be able to discuss and share insights into how they are responding to new and emerging issues, including the threat of long-term environmental impacts of a changing climate.

Our host this year is Gladstone Regional Council Mayor, Matt Burnett, who is very much looking forward to welcoming you to a region that is known not only for its coastal towns and island destinations, but also for its strong, diverse economy. Gladstone Regional Council has some exciting things in store for delegates which only add to the opportunities available from this event.

Alongside elected members and senior officers, we will also welcome the project managers of the LGAQ's QCoast2100 program, which has assisted 31 coastal councils to advance coastal hazard adaptation planning in Queensland, and who will have their own dedicated workshop stream on day two.
